## **Guidelines for Proper Prophetic Procedures**

Guidelines help you to effectively minister to the Body of Christ.

1.	No personal prophesying outside of designated times and areas					
	Only share a prophetic word with someone during the times					
	during the meeting while under the oversight of leadership.					
	Do not prophesy of proper oversight.					
	Because:					
	⇒ All prophetic words are recorded.					
	⇒ We evaluate to ensure that people are not misled and that they respond appropriately.					
	$\Rightarrow$ As hosts we are responsible to God, yourself and your pastor/oversight.					
2.	Be edifying					
	But he who prophecies speaks edification, exhortation and comfort to men					
	Always seek to be and encouraging – not correctional or					
	directional.					
	Harshly spoken and condemning prophecies generally prove to be unfruitful as					
	they do not the nature and character of God correctly.					
3.	Stay teachable					
	<ul> <li>Maintain a submissive teachable spirit towards your pastor and local church leadership.</li> </ul>					
	Eagerly receive input and correction.					
4.	<ul> <li>Give personal prophetic words only under ministerial <i>supervision</i></li> <li>The policy is all personal ministry should be given under supervision to provide a witness by the</li></ul>					
	<ul> <li>Do not draw people aside and give personal words (back at home fellowship/church).</li> </ul>					
	<ul> <li>Have your / present to witness any word given or write it down and give it to your leadership who can pass it on if they consider it is appropriate.</li> </ul>

5.	Review your personal prophecy with your leadership

# Differences between Old Testament and New Testament Prophets

#### **Old Testament**

#### Visible – high profile. (Samuel, Elijah, Elisha)

- 2. People were dependent on the prophet for gifts.
- Preoccupation with sin / flesh.Natural, carnal areas.
- 4. Brought fear and awe. People trembled when Samuel came to town (1 Sam 16:4) David anointed
- 5. Had exclusivity of special revelation
- Unusual lifestyle and manner (Elijah, Isaiah, Ezekiel)
- 7. Gained their credibility by the infallibility of their words. (Duet 13, Luke 13:34)
- Generally individualistic, breezed in from nowhere, did their job and left. No accountability to anyone.
- Had a short season of effectiveness (Jonah)
- 10. Addressed kings and kingdoms.

Played god

#### **New Testament**

- Invisible low profile. Part of foundations. (Eph 2:20)
- 2. People released to function in the gifts. (Eph 4:11)
- Preoccupation with spiritual things in the heavenlies – warfare.
- 4. Bring hope, joy and rejoicing. (1 Cor 14:3)– edify Build up, exhort encourage
- 5. Equip the saints to move in revelation.
- 6. Naturally, normally spiritual.
- 7. Gain their credibility from the integrity of their heart character and fruit.
- 8. Join in relationship together and are not isolated part of a team
- 9. A life-time of fruitfulness
- 10. Help to raise up God's Kingdom
